As **MATHEMATICIANS** we will:

We will use our knowledge of number bonds to help answer questions within 10.

We will continue to follow Mastery of Number to develop good number sense.

We will learn to add and subtract within numbers to 10.

As **WRITERS** we will be:

Developing our sentence structure using our phonics and knowledge we have learnt already.

Children will continue to use capital letter, full stops and finger spaces in their writing. They will develop their imagination through story writing.

Concentrating on our handwriting.

As **READERS** we will be:

Continuing to practise phonics using the Read Write inc to develop our reading.

Clarifying, making predictions and summarising books.

In **History** we will be:

answering the question: What toys from the past are still popular today?

Learning about toys from our past we will observe and compare how toys were different in the past to the present and which ones are still played with today.

In **Science** we will be:

Learning and identifying a variety of everyday materials. We will be distinguishing what materials an object is made from and why this material is suitable for the objects purpose.

We will be doing various experiments to test what material will be suitable as a waterproof jacket for a Teddy.

In **R.W** we will be:

Learning about our similarities and differences between ourselves and a friend. The children will think about how they are unique and special.

In **Design and Technology** we will be:

Designing, making and evaluating a toy car.
