

### Writing Challenge

Can you write a poem inspired by volcanoes or volcanic eruptions? This could be an image poem using description to create a vivid image in your reader's head, a simile and metaphor poem or a rhyming poem. It could even be a shape poem, written in the shape of a volcano.

Think carefully about how you want your reader to feel, and choose your vocabulary carefully to achieve this.

### Maths Challenge

Can you improve your rock status on TTRS by practising at home three times a week, for 5 minutes?

Challenge yourself to solve 3-digit x 1-digit questions using short multiplication. You could use a dice or random number generator to create your questions.

E.g.  $532 \times 6$        $827 \times 4$        $625 \times 5$

### Theme Challenge

Create a fact file or timeline about the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in AD79, when it destroyed Pompeii.

Can you find out about the main events?

Make a parachute using different materials and describe how gravity and surface area affect their landing?
